ABNER GREENE

Professor of Law at Fordham Law School, where he has taught since 1994. Greene has published widely on constitutional law, primarily the First Amendment, in the Yale Law Journal, Columbia Law Review, University of Chicago Law Review, Vanderbilt Law Review, and the Supreme Court Review, among other places. He graduated from Yale College and Michigan Law School, and then clerked for Chief Judge Patricia M. Wald of the D.C. Circuit and Justice John Paul Stevens of the U.S. Supreme Court.



SUZIE NAVOT

Full Professor of Law and Vice President of research at the Israeli Democracy Institute. Previously, she was a faculty member at the Striks Law School - College of Management. She served as the Chairperson of the Israeli Association of Public Law and is currently member of the executive council of the Israeli Association of Legislation. Her areas of research include constitutional law, parliamentary law and political law and she has published two books and over 70 articles in different languages.



M. CLAUDIA CAPUTI

Judge of the Federal Court of Appeals in Administrative Litigation since 2011. Previously, she worked at the Supreme Court of Justice of Argentina as a Secretary-Lawyer (1999-2011).
